Section 2.3 Curfew

No minor under the age of eighteen (18) shall loiter, wander, stroll or play in or upon the streets, parks, playgrounds or other property of NBT between the hours of 11:00 p.m. on any day and 6:00 a.m. of the following day; provided, however, that on Fridays and Saturdays the effective hours are between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. The provisions of this rule apply in the following instances.

Section 1.9 Vehicles

- A. One car per licensed driver per household. This does not apply to motorcycles. In the case of a complaint or controversy, you may be asked to provide the office with a copy of each persons drivers license.
- B. Every unit has one (1) numbered parking space assigned exclusively for the use of that unit. All other members and guest vehicles shall park in available un-numbered spaces. Members must park in their assigned spaces first when the numbered spot is available.
- C. Entire vehicles must be parked between the yellow lines provided.
