










### Winter Reminders:

Outside faucets should be turned off at the first frost. If you need help please call the office for a work ticket.

The proper procedure is as follows (Section 5.9 Outside Faucets): Shut water off underneath your kitchen sink (or some are located in the utility room), then open the faucet valve outside and disconnect the water hose. Allow the faucet to drain then turn it to the off position. If this is not done, it can freeze and burst the pipe inside the wall and member will be responsible for the repair.

The board convened at 5:30 p.m. Present were Selma Irey, president; Sheila Johnson, first vice president; Ann Halsey, second vice president; Esther Shelton, secretary; and Dorothy Olson, treasurer.

Also attending were Elizabeth Tharp, office manager; Sherri Ladd, assistant manager; Les Dudrey, maintenance supervisor; Chris Curlett, assistant maintenance superintendent; Dudley Leonard, cooperative attorney; and Melva Linville, property manager, and Betsy Kilker, administrative assistant, with Linville Management Services, Inc.

### Open Session

Eight members signed in for the open session. An officer with Signal 88 also attended the open session. Selma welcomed them and called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

Minutes of the August 12 meeting were unanimously approved.

Kristen and Josh Goromby were acknowledged as the Good Neighbor of the Month.

Dorothy gave the treasurer's report. She has reviewed all receipts for August and found them to be in order.

Esther reported that six installation/alteration permits had been received and approved.

Sherri presented the office report. Four units are available: one one-bedroom unit, two two-bedroom units

And one three-bedroom unit. In August, there were three move-ins, 44 exterminations and 41 defaults.

Only 21 households remain to re-sign Occupancy Agreements and receive the revised ``Rules We Live By.''

The pest control company will begin exterminations on Wednesdays instead of Tuesdays. Extermination dates will be the first and third Wednesday of every month.

Les gave the maintenance report. Maintenance has been making concrete repairs, seeding some areas, trimming trees, cleaning up after storms and painting the outside of the front doors.

Maintenance plans to coordinate annual inspections with the changing of furnace filters, checking smoke alarms and cleaning flame sensors on furnaces.

Les reminded members to turn off the outside water as winter weather arrives.

Shirley Bryan won the door prize drawing.

The open session ended at 7:20 p.m.

No flushable wipes or cleaning pads, No sanitary supplies or feminine products, No paper towels or baby wipes, No disposable diapers, No flushable cat litter. Grease should NEVER be put down stools or drains.

Want to step up your energy-saving savvy? Here are some energy eye-openers along with ways to conserve you might not have thought of yet.

Energy Eye-Opener: Wasting water needlessly uses electricity. In large cities, the biggest draw on electricity is supplying water to residents and cleaning up the water after it has been used.



**Energy Eye-Opener:** A six-inch pan on an eight-inch burner will waste more than 40 percent of the stove's energy. - Use pots the same size as your burners. Use lids when possible so you can cook at a lower temperature.

Energy Eye-Opener: Devices such as modems and other networking boxes draw power anytime they are plugged in.—Plug your computer, modem and other electronic devices into a power strip so you can turn them all off when you're not using them.<sup>8</sup> This also goes for small appliances in the kitchen that are constantly drawing energy while plugged in. Make sure all power strips are UL Listed.

Energy Eye-Opener: Laptop computers draw 15 to 25 Watts of electricity during regular use, compared to 150 Watts for a conventional desktop computer and monitor.—If you've got both, use your laptop first. When you upgrade, go with a laptop, and take your old computer to an e-waste recycling station. Many electronics retailers now offer take back programs.
