Back to School Sales Tax Holiday

August 4th, 5th & 6th - 2017

By state law, the sales tax holiday begins on the first Friday in August and continues through the following Sunday. In 2017, the three-day holiday begins at **12:01 a.m. on Friday, Aug. 4,** and runs through **Sunday, Aug. 6.**

The sales tax exemption is limited to:

Clothing – any article having a taxable value of \$100 or less

School supplies – not to exceed \$50 per purchase

Computer software – taxable value of \$350 or less

Personal computers – not to exceed \$3,500

If you spend time outside be sure and check for ticks.

How to check for ticks

Check yourself for ticks every day, especially when you have been outside.

1. In and around the hair
2. In and around the ears
3. Under the arms
4. Inside belly button
5. Between the legs
6. Back of the knees

If you find a tick, remove it as soon as possible.

Maintenance Reminders

Did You Know...The water bill for NBT was \$24,785 for the month of June 2017. That amount divided by (382) each household equals \$64.89 per household. When water usage goes over the budgeted amount it costs everyone. Please limit the amount of time that you allow your children to play in the water. Please call in hoses left running (or just go turn it off) and unattended, dripping faucets, toilets running on or phantom flushing.



When watering your lawn the experts say: watering should be done in the early morning. Pre-dawn to no later than 7a.m. That way the water has a chance to dry off the leaves before the sun gets too high. If water remains on the foliage later than 10 a.m., it acts like a magnifying glass and burns the leaves. Watering at night, even in desert conditions can promote mildew. Watering should be done less frequently, and deeper. Watering should saturate the top 1 inch of soil or run for 1/2 hour maximum.

Pest Control

S.O.S. Pest Control treats our facility on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month. This is for preventative maintenance of roaches only. If you are scheduled for a pest control treatment and you are having an issue please call the office so we can make a note for the technician. If you are having an issue with spiders, this requires a different treatment so it needs to be noted. S.O.S. will not enter units that have pets unattended, nor will they enter when children are home without an adult present.

Call the office if you need service.

Dear North Kansas City Schools Parent:

If your child/children are transported on a bus, we ask you to review the following bus stop expectations with your child/children. Certainly, the safest bus stop includes YOU, so we encourage you to be present at your child/children's bus stop. These guidelines help ensure the safety of you, your child/children, and other students.

General Bus Stop Guidelines for Students:

- Please be at the bus stop 5 minutes early.
- Wait in an orderly fashion — no horseplay or running around at the bus stop. Stay out of the streets while waiting for your bus to arrive.
- Board the bus one at a time, with oldest students going first and youngest students going last. (Older students typically sit in the back of the bus, while younger students sit in the front.) NOTE: Exceptions are made for siblings who may board the bus together.

Finish any food or drinks before boarding the bus. No food or drink are allowed because of allergies other students may have.

Bus Stop Guidelines for Parents/Guardians:

To help ensure the safety of all students, we ask parents/guardians to be at the bus stop both in the morning and in the afternoon whenever possible.

Please make a reasonable effort to ensure that all children are safe at the bus stop, although your first priority is the safety of your own children.

- Do NOT physically touch any other children or their backpacks unless a life-threatening situation presents itself.
- Do NOT offer any other children (other than your own) food, candy, or drink at the bus stop without the permission of their parents/guardians. Many children have food and drink allergies.
- Verbally assist/direct children to line-up in a safe and orderly fashion – oldest to youngest – as the bus approaches.

Immediately report any inappropriate parent/guardian actions outside of these guidelines to your apartment complex office personnel.

“There is no perfect school bus stop, because it is impossible to eliminate all potential hazards, but guidelines and training are still necessary to ensure that responsible parties are making the safest, most informed decisions when establishing stops. Without parental participation, there is probably no (truly) ‘safe’ bus stop.”—
