

Maintenance Reminders

With the winter season approaching, make sure you are not parking over the curb. Parking over the curb could impede snow removal.

Section 1.9 Vehicles

J. Members, any person of the member's household, a guest or any person under the member's control are required to park so that their vehicles do not extend over the sidewalks. Should a vehicle extend over the sidewalk during snow removal, the member will be charged. Vehicles parked in No Parking zones that impede snow removal will be towed at the owner's expense without warning.



Winter Reminders:

Outside faucets should be turned off at the first frost. If you need help please call the office for a work ticket.

The proper procedure is as follows (Section 5.8 Outside Faucets): Shut water off underneath your kitchen sink (or some are located in the utility closet). Disconnect the water hose, open the faucet outside. Allow the faucet to drain then leave the faucet on. If this is not done, it can freeze and burst the pipe inside the wall. The member will be responsible for the repair.
