Candles may be pretty to look at but they are a cause of home fires — and home fire deaths. Remember, a candle is an open flame, which means that it can easily ignite anything that can burn.

"CANDLE WITH CARE"

- Blow out all candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Avoid the use of candles in the bedroom and other areas where people may fall asleep.
- Keep candles at least 1 foot (30 centimeters) away from anything that can burn.

Think about using flameless candles in your home. They look and smell like real candles.

- Use candle holders that are sturdy, and won't tip over easily.
- Put candle holders on a sturdy, uncluttered surface.
- Light candles carefully. Keep your hair and any loose clothing away from the flame.
- Don't burn a candle all the way down—put it out before it gets too close to the holder or container.
- Never use a candle if oxygen is used in the home.
- Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage. Never use candles.

Candles and Kids

Never leave a child alone in a room with a burning candle. Keep matches and lighters up high and out of reach, in a locked cabinet.



- December is the peak month for home candle fires.
- More than one-third of home candle fires started in the bedroom.
- Three of every five candle fires start when things that can burn are too close to the candle.



Water Faucet Reminder

It's about that time...the weather is getting colder and the outside hose valve should be turned off.

The proper procedure is as follows:

Shut water off underneath your kitchen sink (or some are located in the utility closet). Disconnect the water hose, open the faucet valve outside. Allow the faucet to drain completely, then leave the faucet on. If this is not done, it can freeze and burst the pipe inside the wall and member will be responsible for the repair.
